CultureLAB is a program to help artists make more art.



If you are an artist you can apply to

• be part of the program



• get money from us to make a new art project.

What is CultureLAB about?

We want more artists in Australia to make art that

- is new and different
- makes people think.

We help artists to

- play with new ideas
- try out new technology
- work together
- mix different art forms.
- We want artists to have time and a place to make their art.











Who can apply for CultureLAB?

CultureLAB is for people who already work as artists.

You can apply if you have a good idea for a new art project.











We support all kinds of art, including

- music
- theatre
- dance
- film and photography
- digital art.

Digital art means art you make on a computer.







We support all kinds of artists, including

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- people of colour
- people with disability
- Deaf people
 - neurodivergent people.



Neurodivergent means your brain works in a different way.

For example, if you are autistic.



What should your art project be?

Your art project should be **engaging**.

Engaging means you try something new or different to connect with your audience.



Your art project can be something you do

• in person



or

• on a screen





or

• both.



You can apply to make your art project

• alone



• with other people.



We like art projects that bring together people who do **not** normally come together.

We also like art projects that make people think about






and

• community.



For example, your art could make people think about where they feel they belong.





If we choose you, we will help you make new art between July 2025 and June 2026.



You will get

• up to **20 thousand** dollars to help you with your art project



 a work space at North Melbourne Town Hall that you can use for 2 to 4 weeks



• technical support

for example, someone can help you with lights and sound.

You will be able to

• talk to other artists



• learn from other artists.



Who will recommend the artists?

Our art experts will recommend up to 6 art projects they like best.

Our art experts are

• the Arts House creative team



and

• 5 working artists.



How can you apply?

You can send us an expression of interest.

Expression of interest or **EOI** means you apply.



When you send us your EOI you must

• answer 4 questions about your art project



 tell us how much you think your project will cost



• show us art you have done in the past.

You can send us your EOI online.


- you want to apply in a different way
